Activity 1 - Six Nations Spelling Bee

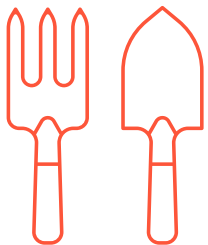
Get a family member to challenge you on our Six Nations Spelling Bee!

Did you know?

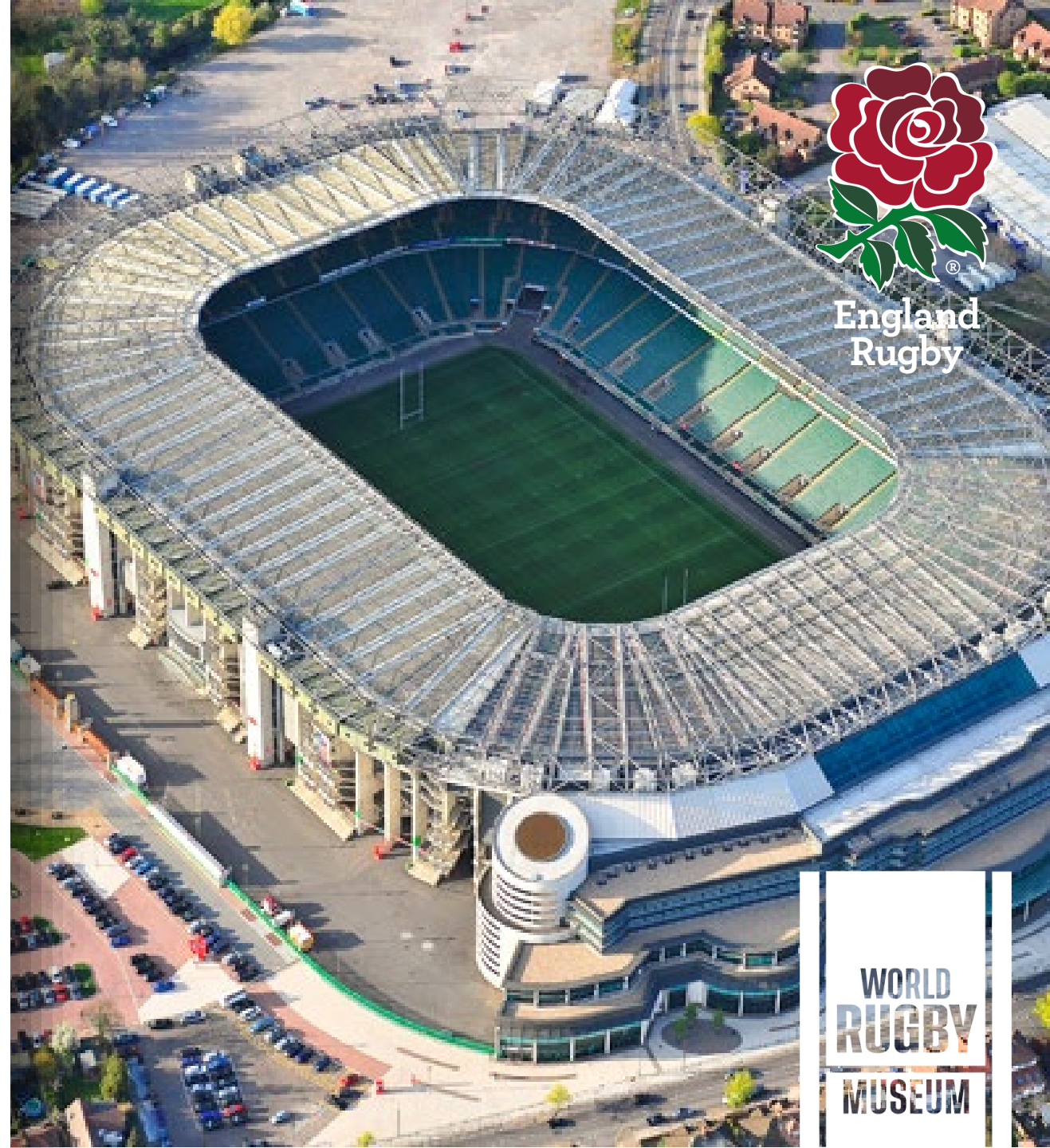

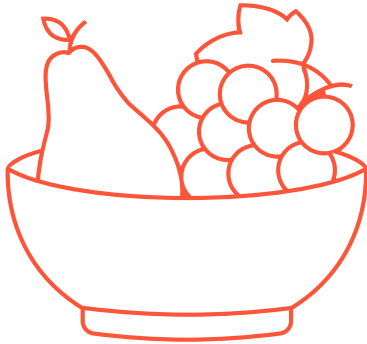
Activity 3 - Design a Stadium

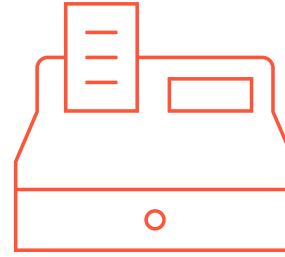
