Did you know?

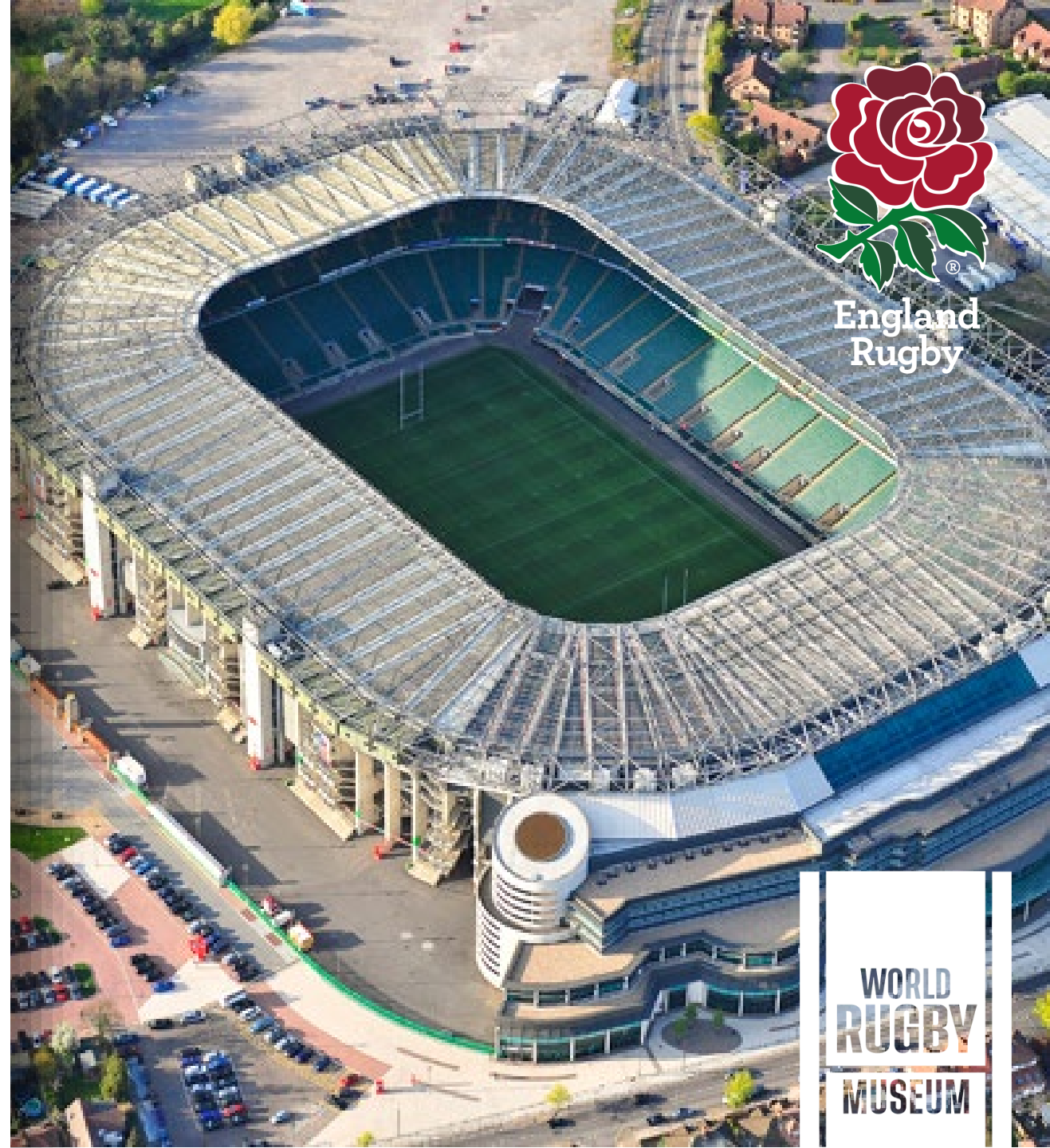
In 1907, the Rugby Football Union purchased a 10 ¼ acre market garden in Twickenham. The man who found the land was called William Williams and it became known as his “Cabbage Patch”. This is where they built Twickenham Stadium.

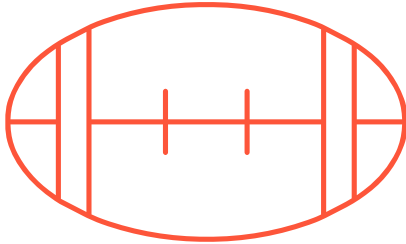
Activity 3 - Design a Stadium

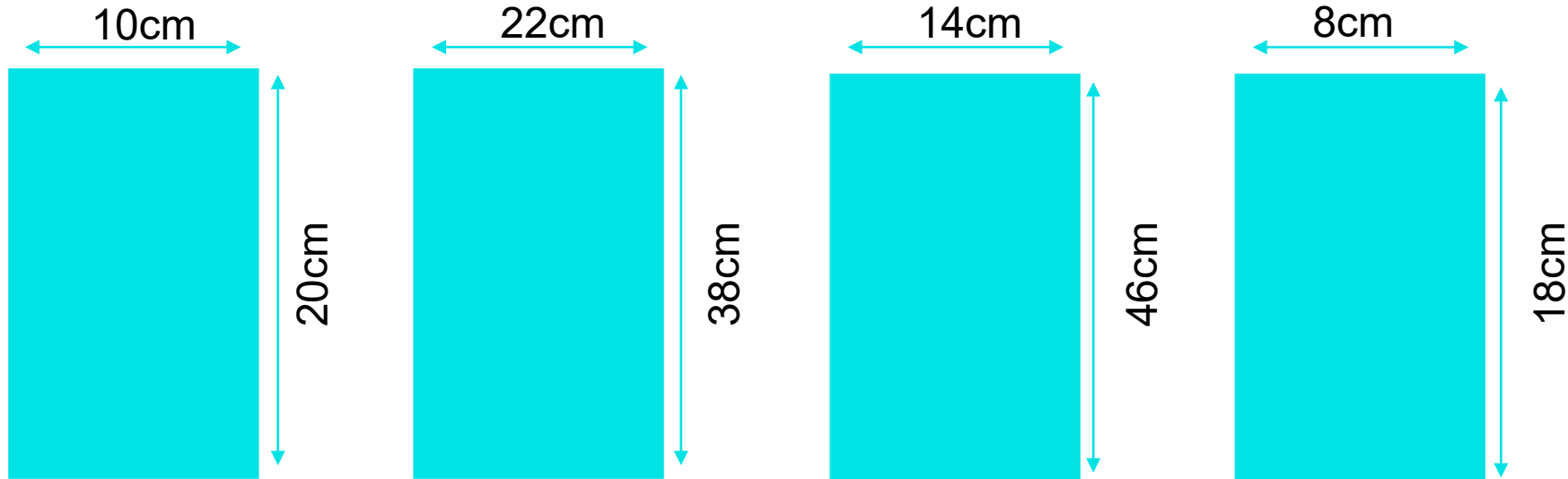

bombing.

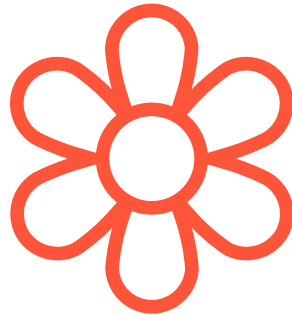
